Congratulations on your qualification for the 2022 California Junior High Rodeo Division (CJHRD) State Finals Rodeo. The events that you have qualified in for the 2022 State Finals are provided by your district secretary along with a direct link to enter the rodeo via an online portal. Contact your district secretary first with any questions.

Please print this full entry packet and read through all of the information about entries and the rodeo in general before accessing the online entry portal. This important step will help you understand the details, deadlines and requirements and can save you additional fees and duplicated entries. No refunds will be given due to mistakes and duplicated entries. The draw will take place on April 22 and the link will be posted on www.chsra.com

Entries for the CJHRD rodeo are only taken via the online entry portal. All entries, stalls, camping and payments will only be taken online. The link to the entry system is included in your qualification email from your district rodeo secretary, as well as posted on the CHSRA website, www.chsra.com. Entries are open from April 11 through April 15, 9:00 pm. Late entries will be accepted until April 17, 2022 with a \$100 late fee.

In addition to entering online, you are required to submit the following 3 printed and signed documents via <u>Google Form</u> on or before April 22, 2022.

- 1. Grade Verification Form/ Concussion Protocol/ Medical Release
- 2. Most Recent Report Card (original copy)
- 3. Tehama County Fairgrounds Release of Liability

If these items are not received on or before the deadline, your entry may be rejected and the next alternate will roll up into your position.

Rodeo Entry Procedures

Entries open on April 11 and close on April 15, 2022 at 9:00pm. (Late entries will be accepted through April 16, 2022 with a \$100 late fine.)

- Payments must be made at the time of entry with either Visa or MasterCard.
- To avoid additional fees or multiple entries, please complete the entry planning form in this packet for your own use before accessing the online entry portal. This step will help to ensure that you have all of the necessary information ready for a smooth and complete entry process.
- Contestants may nominate themselves as an event director for the rodeo on the entry form. You must be entered in the event you are nominating yourself for. Voting will take place via email on a Google Form from May 1-7

Rodeo Check-In (Location: Outside Rodeo Office) Shooting contestants must check in before arriving at range.

Check-in Schedule: Tuesday, May 10, 5:00 – 8:00 pm (Shooting Contestants Should check in at this time)

Wednesday, May 11, 7:00 am – 7:45am (Shooting Contestants Only)

2:00 – 8:00 pm

Thursday, May 12, 7:00 - 7:45 am

- Contestants are required to know their NHSRA membership number J-CA-000***
- Contestants must wear their district vests while checking in at the rodeo.
- All contestants must be checked in by May 12, 2022 @ 7:45 am or be disqualified.

Stall/Pen Rentals

All stalls/pens are reserved and paid for through the online entry portal. Stalling requests must be made on the online entry. Questions <u>after entries close</u> should be directed to Melissa Budden at (530) 520-8730.

- STALLS MAY NOT BE USED AS TACK ROOMS.
- If you are bringing a stallion, this must be mentioned on stalling request line
- Contestants may rent the same number of stalls/pens as events qualified in for \$50 each.

1 event=1 stall

- There are box stalls and covered pens. You will need to identify type of stall/pen requested. Attempts are made to fulfill requests, but **they cannot be guaranteed**. You must make requests on the entry form
- Only one horse is allowed per stall/pen.
- Covered panel pens will have shavings upon arrival because they are set up on asphalt. None of the other stalls/pens will have shavings at arrival.
- Shavings will be available for purchase on site.
- Mandatory cleaning
 - o Box Stalls: Fully clean box stalls of shavings and manure dump in designated areas.

- o Panel Pens: Scrape all shavings and manure to the center of pens.
- Extra stalls might be available after April 22, for \$150 each. However, neither the type nor location can be guaranteed. The stalling will not be rearranged for extra horses. <u>Do not show up with horses</u> if you have not reserved/paid for a stall on your entry

Camping

Camping reservations are made and paid for through the online entry portal. The **length of your trailer/RV is required**, so have the information available when you begin your entry. Requests will only be taken on the entry forms. **If you plan to camp together, YOU MUST ARRIVE TOGETHER**. Questions **after entries close** should be directed to Melissa Budden at (530) 520-8730.

- At the time of entry, 1 camping spot per family (not per contestant) may be reserved
- RV or Trailer \$130 per site w/hook-ups (most sites have electricity, and water is within reach of filling) An extra hose and water tee are recommended
- Dry/tent camping \$30 per site
- Your RV will be checked in when you arrive at Gate 7 off of Trinity Avenue. Your assigned camping and stalling locations will be provided at that time. If you want to camp together, you MUST ARRIVE TOGETHER
- Septic pumping is included in camping fee. Half will be serviced Thursday, the remainder on Friday
 Details will be available when you arrive
- Horses are NOT allowed in any camping areas.

Personal Motorized Vehicles

No motorized gas or e-assist type vehicles are allowed on the grounds. For example: personal golf-carts, motorcycles, scooters, e-bikes, etc. Contestants will be disqualified if a family member, friend, or contestant is using one. Handicapped access or special permits can be requested by emailing Joel Church, jlazythree@aol.com.

Disciplinary Committee

This committee of state board and district presidents (or designated representative) will meet at 7:00 am before each rodeo to discuss any rule violations (outside of the arena competition rules) that arise with contestants, parents or family members. On Thursday, a representative from districts 1,4 and 7 shall be part of the committee, along with members present from the CHSRA Executive Board. On Friday, districts 2,5 and 8 will be representatives, and on Saturday, districts 3,6 and 9 will serve on the committee. If a member is asked to meet with the disciplinary committee, the member shall have the district president or adult junior high representative present during the meeting as an advocate for the member. Please see attached Disciplinary Committee description for more details

Dress Code

Dress code will be enforced at all times. Please be aware of the areas where full western attire is required for both contestants and associate members.

- Contestants must be in rodeo dress code during the rodeo whether in the arena or in the grandstands.
- Associate members must be in rodeo dress code when helping contestants in or near the arena.
- All contestants are required to wear their district vests and rodeo back numbers at all times whether at the fairgrounds or in the community.

Mandatory Ground Rules Meeting

Thursday, May 12, 8:00 am in grandstands

- Contestants are required to attend (in full dress code)
- Parents are STRONGLY encouraged to attend
- Student and Adult event directors are introduced during the meeting
- District team pictures are immediately following

Grand Entry

• Each district is required to participate in Grand Entry. Please make sure to have 3-4 contestants who are able to carry sponsor flags and we encourage you to participate, even if you cannot carry a flag

State Event Director and Officer Elections

- Contestants may nominate themselves for an event director position in an event that they are qualified in. To do so, their name must be included in the student director section of the online entry form.
- Student members may sign up in the rodeo office by 7:45 am on Thursday, May 12th to run for any state office (President, Vice President or Secretary). Voting will take place from May 12th at noon until Friday, 5 pm. Members may display election posters during the rodeo. However, all posters must be removed before the end of the short go-round. Posters that are not removed will leave the member in "poor standing' for the 2022-23 season. The newly elected officers will be announced at the activity on Friday night. Newly elected officers carry flags during the short go grand entry.

Contestant Activity**Subject To Change

Friday, May 13, 8:00 - 10:00 pm (Casual dress with district vest and back number) One adult chaperone is required from each district. Chaperone names are due to Jen Fleming no later than Friday, May 12th, 12 pm.

Short Go

The top 15 in each event will come back on Saturday for the short go performance. Barrel racing and pole bending are a random draw for the short go. Rough stock and timed events will run lowest to highest (score) and slowest to fastest (times) for the short round. (15th-1st)

Awards

The awards ceremony takes place about 60 to 90 minutes after the short go-round. Awards are given to the top seven in each event and based on aggregate times of the 2 long go-rounds and the short-round. State finals event champions are determined by the lowest aggregate time or highest total scores regardless of the total points in the events. The national finals qualifying team will be announced at the award ceremony.

National Team Qualifiers' Meeting – (Top 4)

A mandatory contestant and parent meeting for all national qualifiers follows the awards ceremony.

- The NHSRA Junior High Division Rodeo Finals is in Perry, Georgia, June 19-25, 2022. If you qualify, you will need to declare your decision to participate during the meeting.
- All national finals rodeo paperwork and payments must be completed and turned in to the state secretary,
 Jen Fleming, at this meeting. Some of the paperwork must be notarized so please have your government
 ID with you. Notaries will be available on site. National finals rodeo camping and stalling will also be
 paid with paperwork submission. If you would like to complete any/all of the NJHRF paperwork ahead
 of time, it will be available on the CHSRA website in advance of the CJHRD finals rodeo.

Disciplinary Action

CHSRA shall have the right and responsibility to enforce the rules of the National High School Rodeo Association. Action taken may include disqualification, censure, probation, removal, suspension or expulsion. Disciplinary action shall be authorized against any member, contestant, parents or guardian of members or contestants, or any member of the public attending a national, state/province rodeo, district qualifying rodeo or CHSRA sanctioned function. A member or contestant may be subject to all disciplinary procedures due to action of parent or guardian.

In the event that an issue must come before the disciplinary committee, the contestant shall be notified as soon as possible by the person or persons disqualifying the Contestant.

The contestant must have his or her district adult representative with him or her at the meeting. Parents and guardians are not allowed at the hearings.

The following disciplinary committee structure has been established for both Junior High Division State Finals for 2022:

This committee of state board and district presidents (or designated representative) will meet at 7:00 am before each rodeo to discuss any rule violations (outside of the arena competition rules) that arise with contestants, parents or family members. On Thursday, a representative from districts 1,4 and 7 shall be part of the committee, along with members present from the CHSRA Executive Board. On Friday, districts 2,5 and 8 will be representatives, and on Saturday, districts 3,6 and 9 will serve on the committee. If a member is asked to meet with the disciplinary committee, the member shall have the district president or adult junior high representative present during the meeting as an advocate for the member.

In the event that the president or designated representative are serving on the committee, another appointed representative (so long as the representative is not the parent or guardian of member) shall stand in with the member as their advocate.

- Members must enter using the online entry form, as with all other state finals events. Entries close on the same date as all other state finals events, no sign ups will be held at the rodeo.
- Contestant vest and back number must be worn at all times.
- Contestants must provide rifle and ammunition meeting requirements for this competition.
- Eye and ear protection is mandatory for all competitors while on the firing line.
- Any firearms displayed or brandished in public or at the Fairgrounds will result in disqualification from the CJHRD State Finals Rodeo.

- Range is a private facility and not available for practice prior to the competition.
- The top 4 placers from the shooting match will be invited to represent California in the national contest at the NJHR Finals, June 19-25 in Perry, GA. Contestants who qualify for the national team must plan to attend the national team meeting on Saturday after the short-go to participate in CA nationals team sign up.

CONCUSSION INFORMATION SHEET




This sheet has information to help protect your children or teens from concussion or other serious brain injury. Use this information at your children's or teens' rodeo, events and practices to learn how to spot a concussion and what to do if a concussion occurs.



WHAT IS A CONCUSSION?

A concussion is a type of traumatic brain injury—or TBI—caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or by a hit to the body that causes the head and brain to move quickly back and forth. This fast movement can cause the brain to bounce around or twist in the skull, creating chemical changes in the brain and sometimes stretching and damaging the brain cells.



HOW CAN I SPOT A POSSIBLE CONCUSSION?

Children and teens who show or report one or more of the signs and symptoms listed below—or simply say they just "don't feel right" after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body—may have a concussion or other serious brain injury.

SIGNS OBSERVED BY PARENTS, DIRECTORS OR JUDGES

- Appears dazed or stunned.
- Forgets their turn, is confused about the rodeo or is unsure of an event, time, or score.
- Moves clumsily.
- Answers questions slowly.
- Loses consciousness (even briefly).
- Shows mood, behavior, or personality changes.
- Can't recall events prior to or after a hit or fall.

SYMPTOMS REPORTED BY CHILDREN AND TEENS

- Headache or "pressure" in head.
- Nausea or vomiting.
- Balance problems or dizziness, or double or blurry vision.
 Bothered by light or noise.
- Feeling sluggish, hazy, foggy, or groggy.
- Confusion, or concentration or memory problems.
- Just not "feeling right," or "feeling down."

WHAT ARE SOME MORE SERIOUS DANGER SIGNS TO LOOK OUT FOR?

In rare cases, a dangerous collection of blood (hematoma) may form on the brain after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body and can squeeze the brain against the skull. Call 9-1-1 or take your child or teen to the emergency department right away if, after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body, he or she has one or more of these danger signs:

- One pupil larger than the other.
- Drowsiness or inability to wake up.
- A headache that gets worse and does not go away.
- Slurred speech, weakness, numbness, or decreased coordination.
- Repeated vomiting or nausea, convulsions or seizures (shaking or twitching).
- Unusual behavior, increased confusion, restlessness, or agitation.
- Loss of consciousness (passed out/knocked out). Even
 a brief loss of consciousness should be taken seriously.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF MY CHILD OR TEEN HAS A POSSIBLE CONCUSSION?

As a parent, if you think your child or teen may have a concussion, you should:

- 1. Remove your child or teen from the rodeo.
- 2. Keep your child or teen out of their events the day of the injury. Your child or teen should be seen by a health care provider and only return to competition with permission from a health care provider who is experienced in evaluating for concussion.
- 3. Ask your evaluating health care provider for written release instructions for your child or teen return to rodeo competition.

Do not try to judge the severity of the injury yourself. Only a health care provider should assess a child or teen for a possible concussion. Concussion signs and symptoms often show up soon after the injury. But you may not know how serious the concussion is at first, and some symptoms may not show up for hours or days.

The brain needs time to heal after a concussion. A child's or teen's return to rodeo practice and competition should be a gradual process that is carefully managed and monitored by a health care provider.

HOW CAN I HELP KEEP MY CHILDREN OR TEENS SAFE?

Rodeo is a great way for children and teens to stay healthy and can help them do well in school. To help lower your children's or teens' chances of getting a concussion or other serious brain injury, you should:

- Help create a culture of safety for the team.
 - >> Teach ways to lower the chances of getting a concussion.
 - » Talk with your children or teens about concussions and ask if they have concerns about reporting a concussion. Talk with them about their concerns; emphasize the importance of reporting concussions and taking time to recover from one.
 - >> Ensure that they follow the CHSRA/NHSRA rules for safety and the rules of the sport.
 - >> Tell your children or teens that you expect them to practice good sportsmanship at all times.
- When appropriate for their events, teach your children or teens that wearing a helmet can lower the chances of the most serious types of brain or head injury. However, there is no "concussion-proof" helmet. So, even with a helmet, it is important for children and teens to avoid hits to the head.
